Course Code: IDE 1007 Textual Analysis I

Course Pre-requisite(s): The students are recommended to read various short stories, to be familiar with different

types of genres.

Course Description: The aim of this course is to develop students' ability to analyse a text by examining a diverse

range of short stories, poetry, and drama from different writers and periods. This course will introduce the

students, at a basic level, key literary terms and concepts used in the analysis of literature. They will be given the

tasks to learn how to identify and interpret elements of short stories, examples of figurative language, and basic

characteristics of drama. It will improve the students' reading and comprehension skills as well as critical thinking

by making appropriate use of the relevant terms and concepts.

Course Learning Outcomes

At the end of this course students are expected to;

-be familiar with major works in short story.

-identify and interpret the elements within different types of texts

- decipher the message hidden between the lines

-understand the difference between the perspective of the writer and the reader

-approach the texts from a critical perspective
